


Action during the senior men's blue event in Annual Hawaii State Canoe Races at Nawiliwili Harbor on Kauai.—Photos by Ron Haworth


The Outrigger Canoe Club, scoring points in 13 of the 14-event State Canoe Championships, captured the team title Saturday at Nawiliwili Harbor, Kayai.

Nine Oahu canoe clubs and host Kauai took part in the five-hour regatta, sanctioned by the Hawaii Canoe Racing Association. The event was the final and most important race of the five regatta season which began on Kamehameha Day.

Waikiki Surf Club won what is considered the headline race when it defeated Outrigger and Healani, Kailua Leeward Kai and Kauai in the senior men's race over a 2½ mile course.

Outrigger's team victory gave them a clean sweep of the five regattas, an achievement unequalled in almost ten years.

Runnerup Kailua Hawaiian Civic Club had the most individual victories Saturday—five in all—but OCC's depth kept Kailua's upset-minded crews at bay.




GETTING READY — Coach Mark Buck bends to his task of rigging the 'Kakina' before first race.
