

Anaehoomalu Bay Team Moves Into Billfish Lead

Fishermen today brought in two more marlin this morning to raise the tournament's record to 81 but fishing action appeared to taper off slightly.

Only two small marlin were reported caught by the 10 a.m. marine radio report.

James Elliot of New Zealand's Bay Of Islands Swordfish Club, Team 2, caught a 50-pound marlin, and Tommy Miyagawa of the Honolulu Mosquito Trolling Club took a 120-pounder.

KAILUA, Kona—A team with a Big Island name and composed of Oahu and Big Island anglers has vaulted into first place going into the final day of the 12th annual Hawaiian In-

ternational Billfish Tournament.

Meanwhile, fishermen in the 12th annual event have shattered the record for marlin caught in a tournament. Twenty-three marlin were boated Thursday to raise the four-day running total to 79, 13 more than the former five-day record of 63 established in 1967.

With more catches anticipated in today's getaway fishing action, the record is expected to be pushed even higher.

Two anglers on the Anaehoomalu Bay Trolling Club team caught sizeable marlin Thursday, boosting the team from 13th to 1st place in the competition.

Kailua realtor Kenny Young caught a 375-pound fish after a 32-minute fight, and Harry Jefferson of Honolulu took the biggest fish of the day, a 438-pounder which put up an hour and 10-minute struggle.

Young and another team member, Boise Cascade official Ron

Duplanty, each caught a small marlin Tuesday. Thursday's catches brought their team's total points to 1,268.

Dropping to third place with 1,022 points was the Ala Moana Sportman's Club of Oahu, team 1, which had been the front runner in the first three days of competition, but failed to produce a catch Thursday.

Holding second place was the Portland, Ore., team, which had a total of 1,039 points after its captain, Jim Conway, took a 123-pound marlin Thursday. Conway earned a 100 per cent bonus for catching the fish on 50-pound line.

A highlight of the day was a 400-pound marlin caught by Glen Reece, a member of the Panair International Sportsman's Club team of The Netherlands. Young Reece, who is a transplanted Hawaiian living in the Netherlands, caught the fish which was the second largest of the day after a one-hour and 15 minute battle.

The 1970 summer canoe regatta season came to a close at Nawiliwili Harbor, Kauai last weekend with the State championships which produced no surprises.

As expected, Outrigger won its fifth straight meet and the Waikiki Surf Club senior men squad coached by Jeff Chee regained its old winning form and defeated rival OCC.

One surprise, though,

came in the senior women's 1 mile paddle as Kailua proved its Oahu victory was no fluke, winning the event the second time straight. Previously, Waikiki had taken the first three races.

Season totals show OCC far and away the leader with 206 points amassed during the five regattas. Waikiki followed with 161 and Healan finished third with 125. Next came Kailua, 111; Lanikai, 62, and Hui Nalu, 59.

Kai Oni took seventh with its 18. Leeward Kai trailed with 10, Maile Sons 9, Kauai

2 and Order of Kamehameha scored 1.

Racing activity on Oahu continues its summer siesta this week with only two events scheduled.

A gimmick rally sponsored by the Hawaii Rally and with a noon to 2 p.m. registration tomorrow at the Sizzler Steak House Parking lot. The rally gets under way at 2:30.

At the Fort Kam go-kart track, the peewee racers register 11 a.m. tomorrow followed by noon trials and the 1 p.m. races.
