Hui Nalu Waves' Off Regatta Field

Step aside Outrigger Canoe Club. Back to Windward Oahu, Lanikai, Kailua and Koolau clubs. Pack up your canoe Healani, and leave the handling of Waikiki's big waves to the paddlers of Hui

In 4-to-7-foot surf that swamped a dozen canoes and damaged several others, Hui Nalu paddled to an easy 24-point win over Outrigger Canoe Club in yesterday's Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta at Waikiki Beach. Only last Sunday, also at Waikiki, Hui Nalu topped

Beach Boys Top Hui Wa'a

The Beach Boys Canoe Club, with 50 points, breezed to an easy victory in the Hui Wa'a Association's regatta yesterday at Kahana Bay. The Loa'a club was a distant second with 30 points followedc by Windward Kai (24), Kaneohe (23), Kai Ko'o and Kamehameha (18), Lokahi (16), Ka Mo'i (13), Lauho'e (11), Koa Kai (9), Hawaii Kai (7) and Sons and Daughter

Outrigger in the John Kaupiko Regatta by 50 points.

'The crews that survived Waikiki's breaking surf were the ones that had the experienced steersmen," said Chris Faria, an Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association official. "The ability of some of the steersmen to handle waves really showed. Hui Nalu's Fred Hemmings steered several (six) winners, plus there were others. Experience was the key to survival and to winning."

HAWAII'S WARM and sunny Fourth of July holiday turned Waikiki Beach into a miniature Coney Island. From the hotels to the water, Waikiki's narrow strip of sand was crammed with thou-

sands of paddlers and fans. Even the waves were crowded, as Kailua Canoe Club's Sam Hoolulu quickly found out. "Our men's freshman crew was head down and stroking hard for the olulu explained. "when suddenly I saw this guy on a surfboard coming off a wave just ahead.

'Our canoe smashed into the board gashing the surfboard and splitting the bow of our fiberglass canoe, Po'o Kela. From the way water was pouring into the boat,

it's a wonder we didn't sink." Kailua Canoe Club's mishap was but one of the many big-wave related collisions and swampings. In the boys heat for 16-year-olds, Healani and Outrigger tangled on a wave, and later yesterday afternoon, Waikiki Surf Club's koa canoe, the Malia, cracked its hull.

WITH HUI NALU winning nine heats and Outrigger winning eight races, the 27-event Macfarlane Regatta became a contest between Hawaii's two canoe racing

And although Hui Nalu maintained its slight lead throughout the nine-hour regatta, it wasn't until winning the final two events -the senior women and senior men's heats-that the Hawaii Kai club broke the scoring open.

'Hui Nalu's win didn't come easily," said Laura Thompson, the canoe club's president. "In winning the final two events, our orews had to overcome obstacles. "In both races, Hui Nalu drew one of the high-surf lanes while Outrigger drew the easier, and more favored, smooth water lanes. As defending champion of the Outrigger-sponsored Macfarlane Regatta, we wanted this win badly," she said.

To win the blue-ribbon senior men's event, Hui Nalu was forced to come from behind. "I was told that we were in last place midway through the two-mile men's race," said Hui Nalu's crewman Myron Thompson, who spent much of his time bailing water instead of paddling.
