Hui Nalu Wins Oahu Canoe Title

There seems to be some question as to who was the biggest winner of yesterday's Oahu Canoe Championships at Keehi Lagoon Park-the victorious paddlers of Hui Nalu Canoe Club who demolished the 12-club field. or the City and County treasury because of the many parking citations issued near the lagoon race site.

"Parking on the grass without a permit is illegal and it will cost offenders \$10 (\$15 if not paid within seven days)," explained a busy policeman, politely but firmly.

While Honolulu's finest were hard at work tagging cars, Hui Nalu's paddlers were busy racking up winning scores for their whopping 21-point victory over arch-rival Outrigger Canoe Club.

"THE COMPETI-TION was much closer than the scores indicated" reported race director Mel Kalahiki of the sponsoring Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association.

Beach Boys Win Easily

The Waikiki Beach Boys easily won the Hui Wa'a and Surfing Association's Windward Kai Regatta, piling up 55 points to outdistance second-place Kaneohe by 23 points.

The Beach Boys won the women's novice B event; the men's novice B; the men's novice A; the men's masters; the women's freshman; the women's junior, and both the men's and regatta's blue-ribbon women's senior races.

Ackerman, a former long-time Outrigger Canoe Club paddler and steersman, who guided his new chargers to a comfortable nine-second win in the senior men's event.

It's summer fun as Hui Nalu spanks OCC for Oahu crown

The way Kala Kukea sees it, paddling an outrigger canoe shouldn't be like getting an audition with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

"It's a fun summer thing. It's not like trying out for the NFL," said the 36-year-old head coach of Hui

"Our philosophy is to get every-body to paddle," Kukea said. With a 210-member club, that means a lot of crew-shuffling from week to week. "Maybe it's not the best crews, but we want to get everybody involved."

With that philosophy, Hui Nalu split the season's first six regattas with Outrigger Canoe Club. But yesterday was different.

With the Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association title on the line, Kukea filled each of his crews with its best six paddlers and blasted arch-rival Outrigger out of the waters of Keehi Lagoon.

Hui Nalu rolled up 75 points to ger chipped away until it trailed 38-OCC's 54 for an easier-than-expected 35 with eight races left.

team victory and a fourth consecutive Oahu title. Kailua was third with 43 points, Healani fourth with 38 and Lanikai fifth with 33.

Highlighting Hui Nalu's victory was a record-breaking - and, for Outrigger, back-breaking - effort in the junior men's race.

The crew of Steve Wood, Barry McKeown, John West, Rob Burns, Ray Lum and James Kodama covered the 11/2-mile course in 12 minutes, 27.6 seconds — 11.5 seconds faster than the old mark set by Hui Lanakila in 1979.

"They've always had it. It just took time to get their act together," Kukea said of that crew, which hadn't won a race all season.

They gave Hui Nalu a 55-40 lead with just five races to go. And if that wasn't the knockout punch, it at least sent Outrigger reeling against

the ropes.


OCC had been making a comeback, too. Halfway through the meet it trailed Hui Nalu 35-24, but Outrig-

Then Hui Nalu stiffened, edging OCC for second place in the men's open fours, storming to victory in the junior women and winning junior men. In just half an hour OCC's deficit went from three points to 15.

It wasn't a good day for Outrigger. Its boys' 13-under crew, which had won its race, was disqualified for a false start. "That hurt," said head coach Walt Guild. But halfway through the meet he remained confident. "I hate these down-to-the-wire races." he said.

As it turned out, Hui Nalu took all the suspense out of the day when it won both senior men's and senior women's races. And it looked like Kukea's time-sharing philosophy has paid dividends.

"In one crew I have 18 people, so you see how much I have to move crews around," he said. "If they come out and train all year and never get in a race they'll never come back. We might have a guy who's not so good - next year he'll come back and be our best paddler." See results on Page D-2
