

# Hawaiian King Honored

## ... With Canoe Races

Visitors will have a chance to see the skill which brought the ancient Hawaiians here from far across the ocean when eight local canoe racing clubs battle it out in the annual Kamehameha Day Canoe Regatta at Kailua Beach, Sunday, June 13.

Beginning at 10 a.m., the free event will feature 15 exciting outrigger canoe races, including novice and senior races for men, women and children.

Clubs participating in the races will be Outrigger Canoe Club, Waikiki Surf, Healani, Hui Nalu, Lanikai, Kailua Hawaiian Civic Club, Kai Oni and Leeward Kai.

To get to Kailua Beach, and enjoy at the same time a scenic tour of Oahu, take Kalakaua Avenue around Diamond Head, then around Diamond Head Road onto Kahala Avenue. Here you will drive through one of Honolulu's most exclusive residential districts.

Near the end of Kahala Avenue, turn left onto Kealaolu Street and follow it onto Kalaniana'ole Highway.

The highway goes around the southernmost tip of the island past

such sights as Hanauma Bay, Koko Head and Koko Crater, the Blowhole, Sea Life Park on scenic Makapuu Point, and the Hawaiian homestead town of Waimanalo.

At the intersection of Kalaniana'ole Hwy. and Kailua Road, turn right onto Kailua Road and follow it through Kailua town then turn right on Kalaheo Avenue to the beach park.

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## eight clubs in Kam Day canoe races

Eight clubs will vie in the annual Kamehameha Day outrigger canoe racing regatta Sunday off Kailua Beach Park. The first of 15 races will get under way at 10 a.m.

Outrigger Canoe Club is the defending champion. Healani, Hui Nalu, Kailua Hawaiian Civic Club, Kai Oni, Lanikai, Leeward Kai and Waikiki Surf will be seeking to unseat the OCC paddlers.

Blue ribbon events are the senior men's six over 2½ miles and the women's six over one mile.

The Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association, headed by its president Charles Kua-hane and executive secretary John Kapua, is sponsoring the regatta. Lloyd Wong is race chairman.

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## Outrigger, Healani in 'Unofficial' Tie

Nothing official came out of yesterday's Kamehameha Day Regatta except that it was held at Kailua Beach as scheduled by the Hawaii Canoe Racing Association. Unofficially, the 15-race re-

gatta ended in a tie between defending champion Outrigger Canoe Club and Healani Canoe Club.

Two races are under review — Boys 18 and Under and Senior Men.

UNOFFICIAL club standings credit OCC and Healani with 33 points apiece, followed by Waikiki Surf Club with 28, Kailua Hawaiian Civic Club 26, Lanikai 21, Hui Nalu 9 and Leeward Kai 5.

Outrigger surged into an early lead by winning the first three events and placing second in the next three races. Healani, meanwhile, picked up points in the middle and late races and finished with four blue ribbons.

The Senior Men's event over 2½ miles was nip-and-tuck between Hui Nalu, Waikiki Surf and Healani. Hui Nalu held a slim lead for the entire race, however.

Waikiki Surf was able to edge Healani in the final quarter-mile after trailing in third position. Outrigger was fourth.

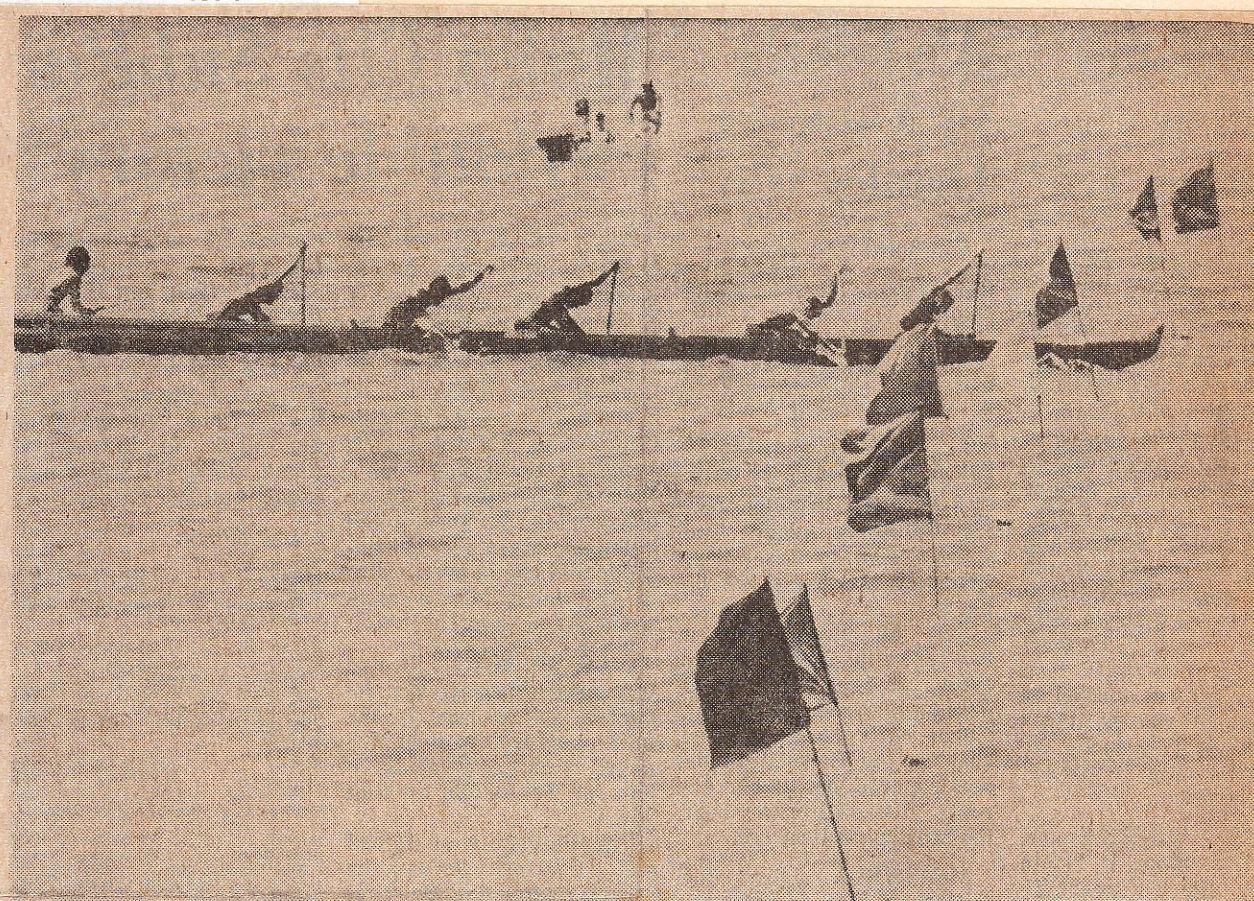
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## Two Clubs Tie In Kam Day Kailua Canoe Race

## Outrigger, Healani tied

Defending champion Outrigger Canoe Club and Healani tied for first place yesterday in the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association's annual Kamehameha Day Regatta off Kailua Beach Park.

Both teams scored 33 points, followed by Waikiki Surf Club with 28, Kailua Hawaiian Civic Club with 26, Lanikai with 21 and Hui Nalu with 19. The standings are unofficial until the results of two races are reviewed.

Pending outcome of the review, Hui Nalu was credited with first place in the senior men's race over two miles in the time of 21 min. 21 sec., with Waikiki Surf second,

Healani third and Outrigger fourth.

Hui Nalu also was the unofficial winner of the boys 18 event in 8:43.7, with Healani, Outrigger and Lanikai finishing in this order.

Healani had four first places, followed by Outrigger with three. Waikiki, Kailua and Lanikai each won two races, as did Hui Nalu unofficially.
