Healani captures canoe regatta

Healani scored 41 points to capture the Leeward Kai's outrigger canoe races yesterday at Pokai Bay.

Hui Nalu took second place with 30 points, followed by Kailua Hawaiian Civic Club with 29. Waikiki Surf Club had 20 and Outrigger Canoe Club 18.

HUI NALU won the men's senior race over 2½ miles in 20 min. 47.1 sec. to beat Healani by 10.4 seconds.

Healani copped the men's junior 2-mile event and the women's senior 1-mile race.

Leeward Kai Canoe Club sponsored the regatta under the auspices of the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association.
