Mrs. Perry-Fiske To Get Medallion

Mrs. Anna Lindsey Perry-Fiske of Waimea, originator of "Old Hawaii On Horseback" pageant, will receive a distinguished service medallion at the Hawaii Heart Association's annual meeting this evening at the Outrigger Canoe Club in Honolulu.

The historical Hawaiian pageant held in May raised more than \$9,000 for the heart fund, the largest amount realized so far in the six years it has been presented.
