

The Molokai Ho'e, the 40-mile men's Molokaito-Oahu race known as the Kentucky Derby of international canoe racing, is scheduled Oct. 10. The women's Molokai race, Na Wahine O Ke Kai, is scheduled Sept. 26.

Outrigger Canoe Club is the defending HCRA state champion, though Healani won the Oahu HCRA title last year. Loa'a is the defending Hui Wa'a champion.
