Hui Nalu's seniors go the distance

At a half-mile from shore, an outrigger canoe looks like a toothpick being paddled by six fleas.

Small wonder, then, that some of the paddlers at Nanakuli Beach Park yesterday addressed the four-mile senior men's race — the last

and glamour event of the Kukini Regatta — with respect.

"That four miles is a looning way," said Steve Scott, steersman for Outrigger Canoe Club's senior crew.

"It's easier when you're in the lead — but I don't know if I'd like to paddle four (miles) if we're behind," Hui Nalu coach Kala Kukea said.

Kukea and the rest of Hui Nalu's senior crew didn't have that problem yesterday, leading all the way to win the four-mile finale and lift Hui Nalu to victory in the Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association's season-opening regatta.

Hui Nalu finished with 65 points. Kailua was second with 53, Outrigger third with 41 and Healan fourth with 37.

In past years the senior men's race was two miles long, but this year the OHORA changed it to four miles. The senior women's race was stretched from a mile to two miles.

"We're going to try it out," race director Mel Kalahiki said. "Some of the paddlers think it's going to benefit the (fall) distance races."

"I think it's great," Waimanalo coach Tusi Kekaula said. "Senior men's is supposed to be the prestige race, so it shouldn't be a short race."

Hui Nalu made the turn first at the half-mile of the out-and-back course at Nanakuli — one of the best sites on the Oahu circuit — but Outrigger put itself back in the race by turning quickly at the mile flag.

The suspense was short-lived, though, as Hui Nalu pulled away to win by more than a minute, 32:17.5 to Outrigger's 33:28.6.

"We weren't worried about conditioning, just with the combination,"

Hui Nalu steersman Myron Thompson said. "It was just a matter of if it was going to click, and it clicked right away."

Hui Nalu has fine-tuned its senior crew, getting a new stroke paddler (Bruce Blankenfeld), a former OCC steersman (Tom Conner) and new paddles with T-tops and a 5-degree forward angle, manufactured by Conner.

How big a loss is Conner for Outrigger? "Personally, I think quite a bit," Thompson said. "He's not only a good athlete, but is an excellent motivating force."

While Hui Nalu fine-tunes, Outrigger rebuilds. "Out of our junior and senior crews, we didn't even get half of 'em back so we had no choice but to juggle people," said Scott. OCC's upper-division men's coach. Only one paddler from last year's state champion senior crew is still with that crew.

"But don't worry," Scott said. "We'll definitely challenge them by the end of the year. They've been together a long time, while we've trained (together) for only two weeks."

The OHORA goes to Kailua Beach Sunday for the King Kamehameha Regatta. The Hui Nalu and Surfing Association season opens June 13 with the Ka Mo'i Regatta at Makaha Beach. See results in For the Record

Kukini Regatta opens canoe season

The Hawaiian canoe racing season gets an early start this summer with today's Kukini Regatta at Nanakuli Beach Park. The 27-event regatta starts at 9 a.m. and runs through mid-afternoon.

The Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association season usually starts with the King Kamehameha Regatta at Kailua Beach, but OHORA officers elected to open the 10-regatta season a week earlier.

The Hui Nalu and Surfing Association, the younger of the two groups, opens its eight-event regatta season June 13 with the Ka Mo'i Regatta at Makaha Beach.

The OHORA will have two surf regattas off Waikiki, the John Kaupiko Regatta June 13 and the Walter MacFarlane on the Fourth of July. Hui Nalu will paddle off Waikiki July 25 in the Beach Boys Regatta.

In surf regattas, the six-person crews have to be careful not to "huli" (flip over) on the waves but can also use the surf to advantage, riding swells back to the finish line.

For the second year in a row, the two associations will not get together for a combined state championship regatta. A scheduling conflict prevents it from happening. The HCRA has an open weekend Aug. 14 and 15, a week after its championships in Hilo, but Hui Nalu has scheduled long distance races on the North Shore Aug. 14.

The Molokai Ho'e, the 40-mile men's Molokai-to-Oahu race known as the Kentucky Derby of international canoe racing, is scheduled Oct. 10. The women's Molokai race, Na Wahine O Ke Kai, is scheduled Sept. 26.

Outrigger Canoe Club is the defending HCRA state champion, though Healan won the Oahu HCRA title last year. Lo'a is the defending Hui Nalu champion.

HILO — The Big Island's Moku O Hawaii Canoe Racing Association is host for the 1982 state championship canoe racing regatta August 7 at Hilo Bay.

Hui Nalu Wins Regatta

Hui Nalu captured the senior men's race in 32 minutes, 17.5 seconds and emerged as the overall winner in yesterday's Kukini Regatta at Nanakuli.

Hui Nalu finished with 65 points to outdistance Kailua (53) and Outrigger Canoe Club (41).
