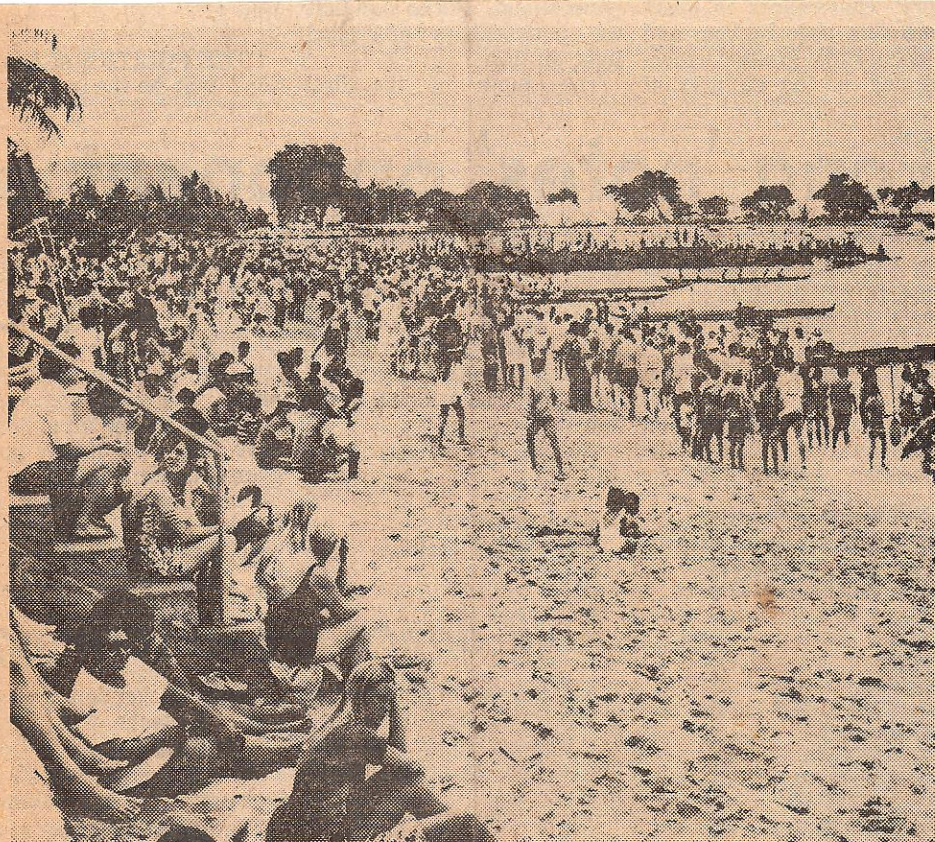
Waikiki Surf Paddlers Eye Second Win

Waikiki Surf Club will be seeking its second straight outrigger canoe paddling championship today.

It is one of nine clubs entered in the Leeward Kai Canoe Club-sponsored regatta in Waianae's Pokai Bay. The 13-race program starts at 10 a.m.

Waikiki Surf edged Outrigger Canoe Club for the regatta championship last Sunday in the Kamehameha Day races at Kailua and also won the senior men's six.

Outrigger and Healani are expected to make strong bids for the title, Hui Nalu, Maile Sons, Lanikai, Kailua Hawaiian Civic Club, Order of Kamehameha and Leeward Kai are also entered.

Waikiki SC edges OCC in canoeing

Outrigger Canoe Club almost had the Leeward Kai Canoe Club regatta title clinched yesterday—but it wasn't to be.

No, Waikiki Surf Club was the official winner in its second straight eyelash triumph over OCC.

Two weeks ago Waikiki SC edged Outrigger by one point in the Kamehameha Day races at Kailua. Yesterday they won by two points (36-34) before a crowd of 5,000 at Waianae's Pokai Bay.

It all happened in the third race of the day, for novice women at one-quarter mile. OCC finished first but found it doesn't pay to change lanes. The boat was disqualified after it wound up in lane eight instead of lane four—the right one.

Waikiki Surf Club Wins Regatta

Waikiki Surf Club captured the Pokai Bay Canoe Paddling Regatta yesterday, edging Outrigger Canoe Club, 36-34.

Outrigger, however, won the senior men's six-man race over 2½ miles in 22 minutes, 9.7 seconds. Waikiki Surf, which won this event a week ago, was third behind Healani.

Kailua Hawaiian Civic Club finished third in the standings with 22 points while Healani and Lanikai were tied for fourth with 15 points apiece.
