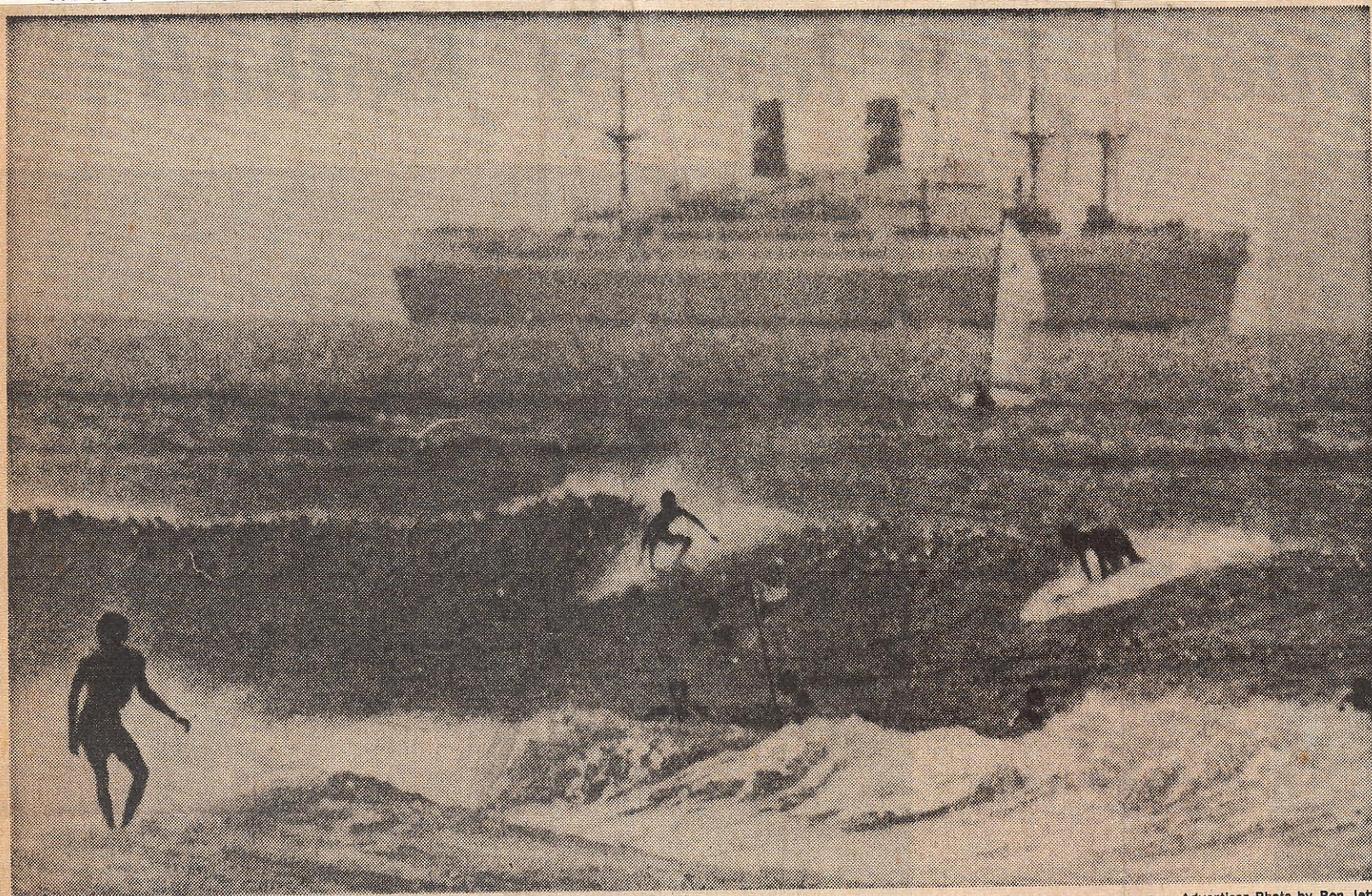

# 'goofy footers' sweep surfing

David Smith led a five-way sweep for "goofy footers" yesterday as the Hawaii State Surfing Championships got underway with the 14-and-under division. The site was Ala Moana.

Action is scheduled to resume today at 7:15 a.m., conditions permitting, with the men's, women's, juniors' and seniors' divisions.

"Goofy foot" is the term for surfers who favor the left stance, and Ala Moana (off the mouth of Ala Wai Harbor) is a left slide surf.

Smith, Io Kai Club; Francis Kealoha, unattached; Bret Goodfriend, Outrigger Canoe Club; Larry Bartlemann, unattached, and Mike Ho, unattached, were the "goofy footers" who took the top five spots in 14-and-under finals.

Robbie Husic, Ewa Beach Surf Club, won favors the right-footed stance, finished sixth.

It was Smith's first surfing title. "He came out of nowhere," said Jan Husic, competition director for the sponsoring Hawaii Surfing Association. "He wasn't seeded, but he was really good."

"Waves were only 3-to-5 feet, with the better sets in

the afternoon up to five feet," Mrs. Husic said. "But they were fast and good rides were made," she continued.

If conditions today do not warrant running off remaining events, the meet will be held next Saturday and Sunday.

Entry proceeds go toward the travel fund for the Hawaii team which will go to the World meet in Africa

next year.

## Kona Billfish Spree Opens

KAILUA—Competition in the 11th annual Hawaiian International Billfish Tournament begins at 8 a.m. Monday when the official starting signal is sounded.

Seventy-seven teams of anglers from around the world will be attempting to haul in the biggest and the most marlin and Allison yellowfin tuna each day of the tournament. Competition hours are from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Bleachers have been erected on Kailua Pier for spectators to watch the official weigh-ins at the end of each day.

Headquarters for the tournament are in the lobby of the Kona Hilton Hotel where tabulations of each team's performance will be made.

On hand for the tournament will be employees of the U.S. Bureau of Commercial Fisheries who will take blood and stomach samplings from the big fish. Scientists will use the information gathered to determine the feeding habits of the billfish.

The U.S. Coast Guard cutter Cape Newagen from Maui will be in the area should the need for rescue arise. The Coast Guard has also made available a helicopter for Thursday and Friday.
