In the dog-eat-dog world of magazine publishing, she's top poodle.

A tousled, petite, saucer-eyed blonde, Paige Rense took over as editor of a modest little California trade journal called Architectural Digest a dozen years ago and turned it into a blue-ribbon winner for Knapp Press.

Credit the Rense thoroughbred style, the best-in-show taste. In fact, Rense is in a class by herself as the first editor-inchief of three major consumer magazines in the United States. Bon Appetit and GEO are also under her aegis. She's called "the Luce of the leisured class." The grooming of Architectural Digest has

become a publishing phenomenon. "It's really a magazine for people who



care about their homes and like beautiful things of great quality," according to Rense. "I patterned it after the elegant European art magazines and knew it would be wonderful because people like to read about - and look at - the best."

Circulation soared from 50,000 to 550,000. Yearly revenues from advertisers like Rolls Royce and Cartier exceed \$30 million. A third of the magazine's readers are corporate board members; a fifth are millionaires; 83 percent are college educated and their average income is in six figures — as is that of editor Rense.

"Digest is an elitist magazine," said Paige, "but I don't think there's anything wrong in being rich." She gladly shares the wealth of the half dozen homes featured in each issue.

Decorators, doyennes and beautiful people beat at her door.

"I select about 200 homes a year, from 4,000 photos and portfolios sent in by architects and designers. I personally see about 1,000 homes, at least three a day. People call and say, 'I hear you'll be in town next week' and invite me for dinner. I go. I take chances - knowing full well 90 percent of the hosts wouldn't be interested in me if my name were not on the Digest masthead.

This no-nonsense, no-pretense approach to life caught the fancy of publisher Clean Knapp when he hired a young freelance writer who frankly told him what was wrong with his magazine: "boring and badly edited." Today, it's neither, because that same power of instant appraisal enables Paige Rense to walk into a home and tell within a matter of minutes if it's Architectural Digest

"It doesn't take that long," corrected Paige, over a campari and soda at the Outrigger Canoe Club. "I look for style, authority, magic. People usually give the entrance and living room their best shot. The rest of the house is not going to vary

"It's like recognizing great art from soso painting. You just know. Scale. Flow. Unity. Nothing that jars. All great interiors have style. Taste is easy. It can be acquired. Style is innate.

"Also I think light is important. It can make or break a decor - or a party. I'd like to see more imagination in lamps. Lamplight is so wonderful. I'm tired of bullet holes in the ceiling. I'm also tired of two chairs flanking a sofa, of books anchoring a coffee table, of paintings over mantels and of being beiged to death.

"Homes should be supportive. They should give us something emotionally. Even celebrities - or especially celebrities — want comfort," continued the author of "Celebrity Homes."

"In my travels around the world, I've noticed that contrary to the idea that the public likes to think celebrities are just like you and me, most people enjoy seeing how differently they live. How much more glamorously. Where's the

magic if their homes are like ours? "For Princess Margaret, comfort is a Caribbean retreat of secluded simplicity. For Fred Astaire, it's an open living room designed around a pool table. He's a shy man who agreed to see me only after I promised not to ask him to name his

favorite dancing partner. "When Digest visited Barbra Steisand in her duplex off Central Park, she said 'Look, this is my first real home. Let me tell you, I wanted Louis, Louis, Louis as much as I could lay my hands on. Now I'm more sophisticated and have moved away from the politeness of all that. I'm more comfortable in my burgundy era . . .' Also, it's the right color to

underscore her Grammies and Oscar." Paige Rense's own home? "A glass retreat on a Beverly hilltop with a fabulous view and a dog named Ben, a stray I found in Benedict Canyon. It's like going to the country.

"I've had only two weeks' vacation in a decade, but I'm totally happy because I love what I do.'

"The weather just created more excitement."

Despite the adverse conditions the regatta had a climactic ending with Hui Nalu clinching the victory — its fourth in as many Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association races this year—in the day's final event.
