Mr. and Mrs. James Chrones and Mr. and Mrs. George Bukes will give a dinner party for the young couple Wednesday.

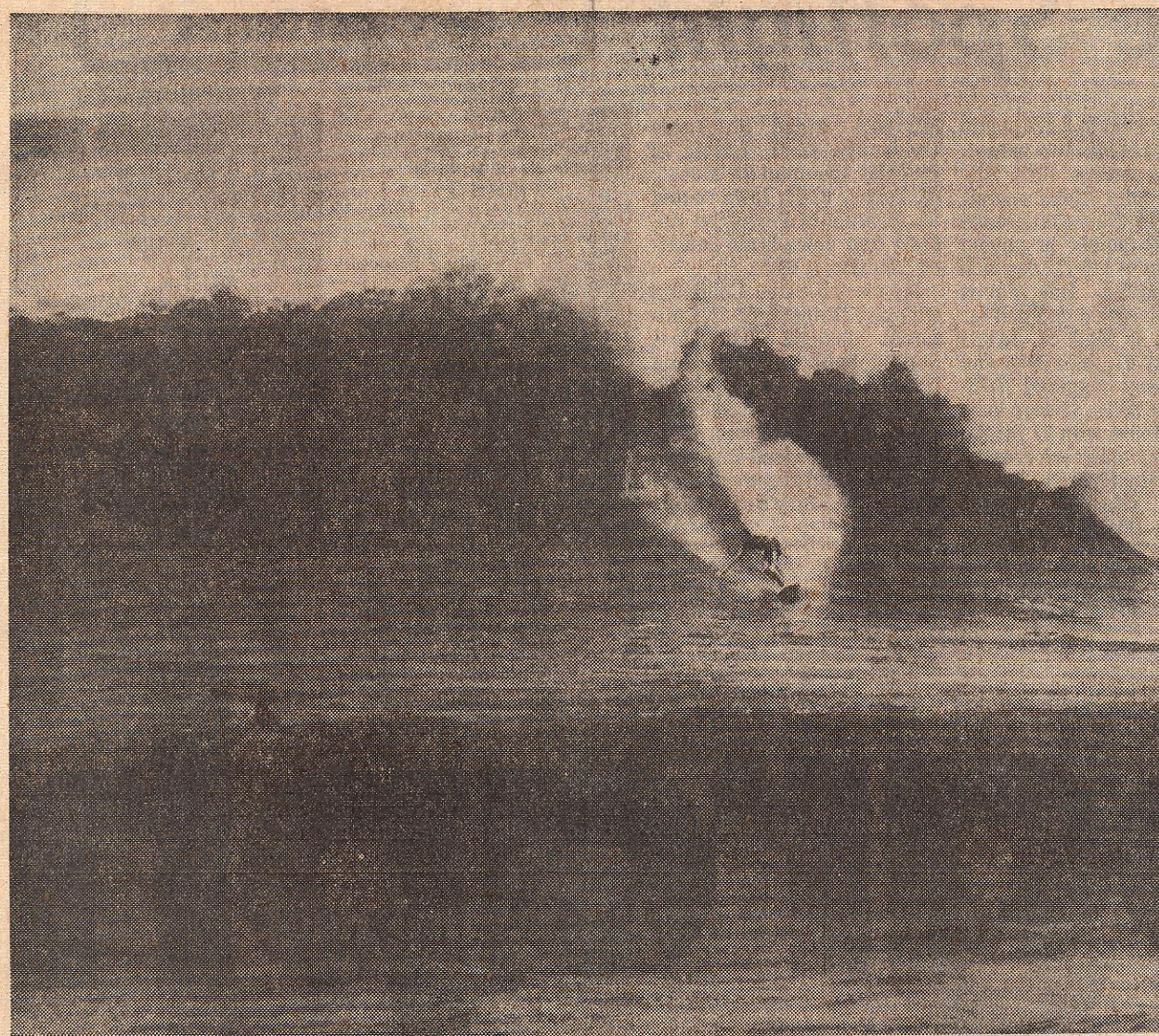
The following evening, Mrs. Charles Clark is giving a kitchen shower for Shirley.
