powerboat races, canoes at K-Bay

Canoe and powerboat racing will highlight sports activities for the 10th annual K-Bay Water Carnival starting today and continuing until Sunday at the Kaneohe Marine Corps Air Station.

The carnival which supports youth activities at the Windward Marine Air Station is open, free, to the public.

The canoe races, sponsored by the Hawaii Outrigger Canoe Racing Association, starts at 3 p.m. tomorrow. Ten canoes will compete in the men's races followed by ladies' competition.

THE FOUR mile course will start from the shore of the Marine Corps Air Station carnival area, continue around Coconut Island and end at the starting point.

Canoe clubs participating are Kailua Hawaiian Civic, Kai Oni, Outrigger, Leeward Kai, Order of Kamehameha, Healani, Lanikai, Maile Sons, Waikiki Surf and Hui Nalu.

The Hawaii Power Boat Racing Association starts its event at 10 a.m. Sunday in Kaneohe Bay with nearly 40 drivers competing in six classes.

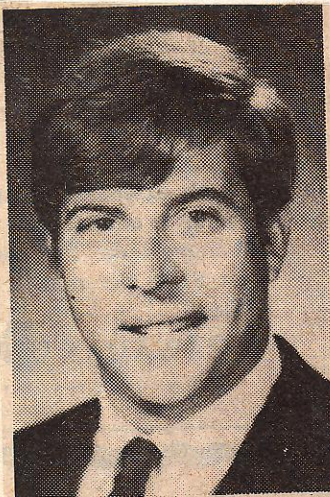
THE RACE will be sanctioned by the American Power Boat Association. Hawaii racers placing tops in the competition will be in the running for national high point awards.

6 named for Heart Assn. fellowships

The Hawaii Heart Association has named six high school students to receive junior research summer fellowships. They provide \$500 stipends and ten weeks of work under scientists doing cardiovascular research.

The awards were presented to Allan B. Chinen, a senior at Punahou; Robert T. Richards; Leilehua senior; Robert J. Ericsson, junior at Damien Memorial; Miles Yasuo Kikuta, senior at Aiea; Caryn Lum, Punahou junior; and Rose Marie Tamura, senior at Kapaa High, Kauai.

They will be assigned to four scientists conducting Heart Association - sponsored research: Dr. Doris M. Hilker of the University of Hawaii Department of Nutrition; Dr. Kerry T. Yasunobu of the University Department of Biochemistry; Dr. Franklin Young, also of the nutrition departments; and Dr. Mitsuo Yokoyama, director of the Kuakini Medical Research Institute.

The fellowships were created in 1966 to encourage gifted science students to consider careers in cardiovascular research and to introduce them to the life of a research investigator.

The six winners will be honored at the Heart Association's June 8 Honolulu meeting at the Outrigger Canoe Club.
