6 named for Heart Assn. fellowships

The Hawaii Heart Association has named six high school students to receive junior research summer fellowships. They provide \$500 stipends and ten weeks of work under scientists doing cardiovascular research.

The awards were presented to Allan B. Chinen, a senior at Punahou; Robert T. Richards; Leilehua senior; Robert J. Ericsson, junior at Damien Memorial; Miles Yasuo Kikuta, senior at Aiea; Caryn Lum, Punahou junior; and Rose Marie Tamura, senior at Kapaa High,
