"These guys are tough—I don't want to mess with them," said the rugged Tom.

TONY CRABB, aided and abetted by brother Chris, had just led the powerful Outrigger Canoe Club to a 14-16, 15-11, 15-11 win in the men's open division over the highly-rated Ken Allyn Chicago white team.

"We (myself and Chris) stuffed them (Allyn) in the last set," said Tony.

And that they did — nine straight points as the OCC advanced to the quarterfinals.

But can OCC beat the powerful Chart House team of San Diego — the top-seeded team in the tournament?

However, there was a Cin-

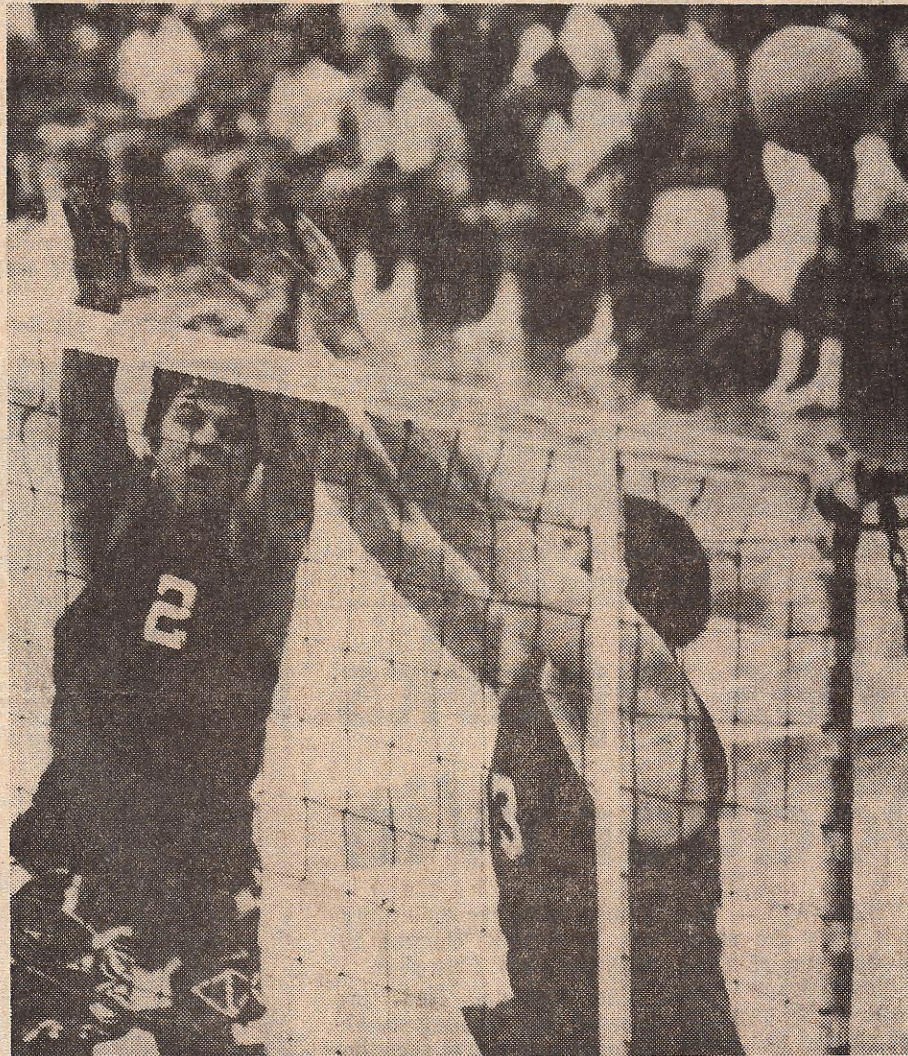
derella tale — Haili-Gold of Hilo kept alive by defeating Nuuanu YMCA, 15-8, 15-8.
