## National Volleyball Finals Tonight at HIC

# Chart House Is Favored for Title

It looks like Chart House in a breeze but there may be two good reasons why the San Diego team may not win the men's Open Division of the National Volleyball championships tonight at HIC Arena.

Those two reasons are Jon Alstrom and Tom Ryan, a pair of 6-7 types.

"Alstrom and Ryan have the height to give Chart House trouble—just like the Russians did to the Japanese team in the Olympics," said Outrigger Canoe Club veteran Tom Haine.

Haine, a tired and weary man after playing in both the open and senior divisions, should know—he had plenty of experience yesterday morning playing the classy Chart House team.

"They're just too good—they isolate you one on one and just destroy you," said Haine.

Chart House, keeping its streak intact of never dropping a set, blitzed OCC, 15-8, 15-9 in a morning game before stopping the highly touted Armed Forces team, 15-6, 15-10 at night at Uni-

This sets up a battle between Chart House and Balboa at 11:15 with the winner advancing to the 6 p.m.

finals at the HIC.

Balboa, led by Alstrom and Ryan, turned back Cis-cos of San Francisco, 15-7, 14-16, and 15-3 in a tough three setter.

Outrigger, needing a win to stay alive in the tournament, could quite make it as they bowed to UCLA, the National Collegiate champs, 15-12, 14-9.

Especially smooth was the play of All-American Kirk Kilgour. Kilgour is one of the more powerful spikers in the tournament and a left to boot.

The Outrigger has a big boomer of its own — Tony Crabb, a cinch to make the All-Star team that will compete this summer in the World Cup in Bulgaria.

Crabb, a stuffer of great skill, kept the OCC in it for a while with some well-placed spikes but the smooth Bruins, with setter Ed Machado quarterbacking the team, had too much finesse for the older OCC team and its flying-circus offense — which frees a back court man up front as a setter doing the trick.

All in all it was a tough day for the local teams. Outrigger's senior team bowed out, losing to Long Beach, 15-7, 5-14, 12-7. Long Beach went on to gain the finals by defeating Balboa Bay Club, 9-6, 12-15, 15-9.

Nuuanu YMCA—runnerup in last year's women's open division—defeated the Windjammers No. 2—pretty pink attire and all—15-8, 16-8, but suffered a setback at the hands of the L.A. Renegades, 13-8, 16-18, 13-9.

This puts the Nuuanu team against Sul Ross—picked as the team to beat—in the morning round.

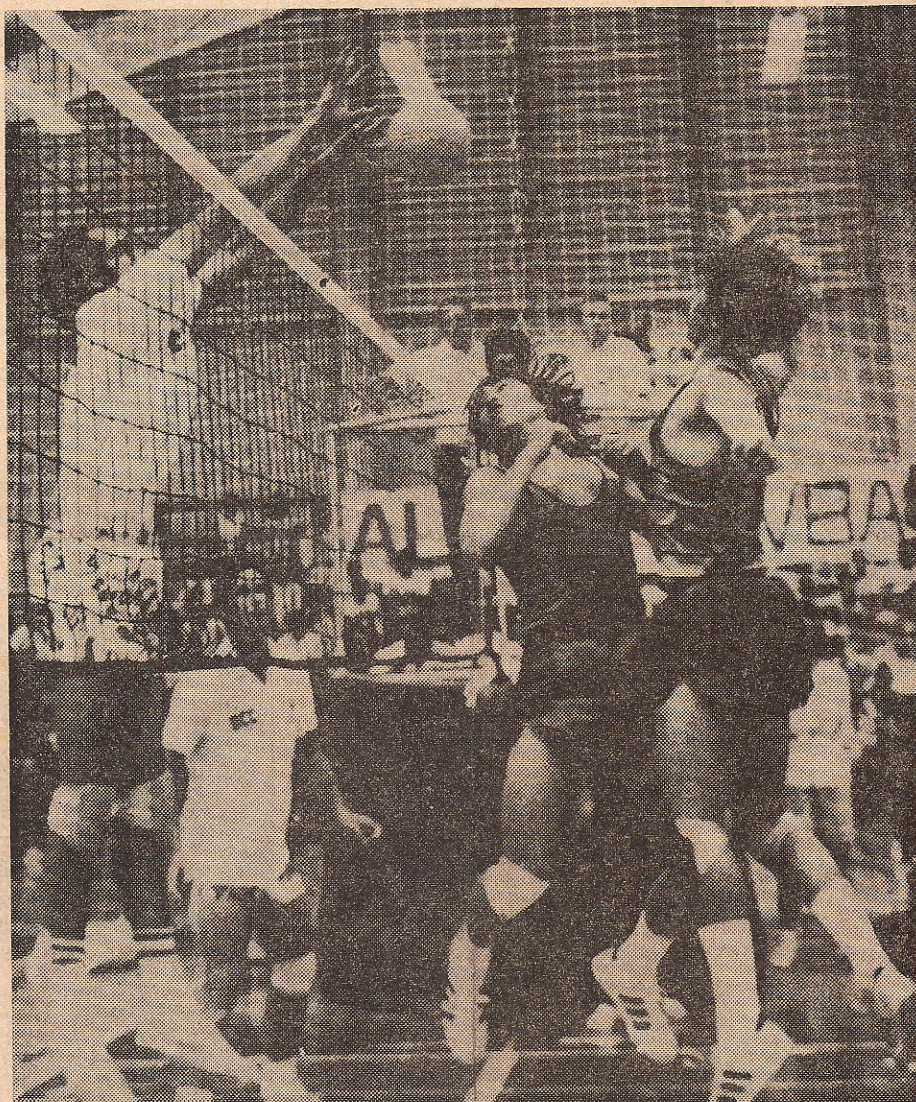

Chart House of San Diego gave an artistic performance of volleyball last night as they moved into the finals of the men's open division of the National Volleyball Championship tonight at the HIC Arena.

The top-seeded San Diego team — playing with seven Olympians — defeated highly-touted Armed Forces team 15-6, 15-10 after downing Outrigger Canoe Club of Honolulu earlier, 15-8, 15-9.

Long Beach gained the winner's bracket finals of the senior open men's division by taking the Balboa Bay Club, 9-6, 12-15, 15-9 at McKinley High School gymnasium.

In the women's division winner's bracket match at Klum Gymnasium, the Los Angeles Shamrocks moved into the finals by downing Windjammers No. 1, 12-9, 14-10.

The Shamrocks will meet the Los Angeles Renegades today. The Renegades downed Nuuanu YMCA of Honolulu, 13-8, 16-18, 13-9.

Haili-Gold team of Hilo bowed out in a morning game, losing to the Portland YMCA, 15-8, 15-10.
